NOW, ON THIS 4TH DAY OF JANUARY 2021, THE FOLLOW-ING RESOLUTION WAS PRE-SENTED TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ACTING AS DRAINAGE DISTRICT TRUST-EES: WHEREAS, SAID TRUST-EES BELIEVE THAT IT IS IN THE BEST INTERESTS OF DRAIN-AGE DISTRICTS THAT INDIVID-UALS, LANDOWNERS, OR EN-TITIES MAKING REQUESTS FOR DISTRICT INVESTIGATION OF REPAIRS BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE COSTS OF THOSE IN VESTIGATIONS IN THE EVENT THAT THE SOURCE OF THE NEED FOR REPAIRS WOULD BE PRIVATELY OWNED TILE AND NOT PART OF THE DRAINAGE DISTRICT FACILITIES OR NO PROBLEM IS FOUND AND THE DRAINAGE DISTRICT FACILI-TY IS ANYTHING OTHER THAN OPEN DITCH BE IT RESOLVED THAT IN THE EVENT ANY INDI-VIDUAL OR ENTITY MAKES A REQUEST TO THE DRAINAGE DISTRICT TO INVESTIGATE PROPOSED REPAIRS WHICH REQUIRE THE DISTRICT TO EX-PEND FUNDS TO DETERMINE THE LOCATION OF NEEDED

REPAIRS, FEASIBILITY OF RE-PAIRS, OR ANY OTHER COSTS INCURRED IN CONNECTION WITH INVESTIGATING THE RE-QUEST AND THAT IN THE EVENT IN THE COURSE OF INVESTIGA-TION IT IS DISCOVERED THAT THE DRAINAGE TILE OR RE-LATED STRUCTURES NEEDING REPAIR ARE NOT UNDER THE DRAINAGE DISTRICT'S CON-TROL THEN THE INDIVIDUAL LANDOWNER, OR ENTITY RE-QUESTING THE INVESTIGATION SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PAYMENT OF ANY EXPENSES INCURRED BY THE DISTRICT. IF SAID INVESTIGATION RESULTS IN NO PROBLEM DISCOVERED, SAID REQUESTOR IS RESPON-SIBLE FOR PAYMENT OF ANY EXPENSES INCURRED BY THE DISTRICT. THIS DOES NOT AP-PLY TO DRAINAGE DISTRICT FACILITIES THAT ARE OPEN DITCHES. IF THE INVESTIGA-TION IN THE DISTRICT FINDS A PROBLEM WITH DISTRICT FA-CILITIES, THEN SAID DISTRICT WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PAYMENT OF ANY EXPENSES INCURRED BY THE DISTRICT AS ALLOWED BY IOWA CODE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ACTING AS DRAINAGE DIS-TRICT TRUSTEES AUTHORIZE THE FRANKLIN COUNTY AUDI-TOR TO PREPARE THE NECES-SARY FORM FOR THE INDIVID-UAL, LANDOWNER, OR ENTITY TO EXECUTE PRIOR TO ANY IN-VESTIGATION (EXCEPT OPEN DITCHES) IN A FORM NECES-SARY TO CARRY OUT THE IN-TENT OF THIS RESOLUTION.
