The Hampton City Council Regular Session was called to order at the Hampton City Council Chambers by Mayor Russell Wood at 6:00 p.m. Council members in attendance were Bill Hodge, Richard Lukensmeyer, James Davies, Steve Birdsall, Patrick Palmer, and Barry Lamos (via Zoom). project. Many options were discussed regarding the deteriorating mausoleums with varying opinions. Mardelle Sidmore VanKleek, Deb Brass and Brian Stevens provided comments. The group will continue to seek input from the general public as well as obtain more detailed cost estimates. The council was favorable to the idea of pursuing a columbarium project.
