MEETING MINUTES

1. The Hampton-Dumont Board of Education met in a Special Meeting on February 3, 2022, in the Boardroom. President Erran Miller called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. Board members Erran Miller, Mark Morrison, Brent Hansen, Stephanie Powers, and Tom Birdsell were present. Board members Elisa Van Wert and Steve Severs were absent. Also present were Superintendent Todd Lettow and Secretary Amanda Heiden.

2. Motion was made to approve the agenda as presented. Motion by Morrison, seconded by Birdsell. All ayes.

3. Motion was made to approve an Early Resignation Stipend for staff. An individual would receive \$1,500 if a resignation is submitted by February 15th, they would receive \$1,000 if a resignation is submitted by March 1st and they would receive \$500 if the resignation is submitted by March 15th. The employee must complete their 2021-2022 school year contract to receive the stipend. Motion by Birdsell, seconded by Morrison. All ayes.

4. Motion was made to approve Sara O'Tool as the Child Nutrition Director at 80% time and to work some of the time from home for the remainder of the 2021-2022 school year. Motion by Morrison, seconded by Hansen. All ayes.

5. Motion was made to authorize the district's administration to submit a request to the School Budget Review Committee for funding related to the fiscal year 2022 Statewide Voluntary Preschool Program increased enrollment to the amount of \$10,840.50. Motion by Powers, seconded by Morrison. All ayes.

6. Motion was made by Powers, seconded by Morrison, to go into closed session as provided in section 21.5(1)(i) of the open meetings law to evaluate the professional competency of an individual whose hiring is being considered to prevent needless and irreparable injury to that individual's reputation, as that individual has requested a closed session.

Roll call vote was taken: Morrison aye; Powers aye; Miller aye; Birdsell aye and Hansen aye. Also present in closed session were Secretary Amanda Heiden and Grundmeyer Services Rep Trent Grundmeyer. The board entered closed session at 5:33 p.m.

Board member Elisa Van Wert arrived in closed session at 5:34 p.m.

7. Motion was made by Birdsell, seconded by Morrison, to return to open session. Roll call vote was taken: Miller aye; Birdsell aye; Hansen aye; Powers aye; Morrison aye and Van Wert aye. The board returned to open session at 6:49 p.m. There was no discussion.

Explanation of significant increases in the budget:
Property/liability/workers compensation insurance premium increases primarily due to derecho claims that hit insurance companies profits hard, and this is being passed on to all insureds. Health insurance premium increase. Increase in public safety dispatching fees from Franklin County Emergency Management. Increases in law enforcement officers wages as a result of nationwide "anti-police" movement that caused a shortage in the supply of officers and an increase in the demand of police officers. This results in taxpayers having to pay higher wages for law enforcement officers to compete with other jurisdictions statewide and nationally. In addition, increases in these wages result in city FICA and IPERS expenses to rise in tandem. Costs of materials, parts, projects, maintenance, vehicles and equipment drastically increasing for the city as a result of the nationwide inflation and supply shortages over the last 12 months. These nationwide economic troubles extend down to the local level in the form of additional burden on local taxpayers.

Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received by the **County Auditor of Franklin County, Iowa, at their office in the Franklin County Courthouse, 12 1st Ave NW, Hampton, Iowa 50441, until 10:15 a.m. on February 28, 2022** for partial main tile replacement of Drainage District 13, Franklin County, Iowa. Plans, specifications and form of contract are on file at the office of the County Auditor and describe the work involved and the conditions under which it is to be performed. Bids will be opened by the Engineer and the Board of Supervisors of Franklin County (acting District Trustees) at a meeting to be held in the Courthouse of Franklin County at 10:15 a.m. on February 28, 2022. Said bids will be acted on at a time and date to be determined at said bid opening. Plans and specifications governing the construction of the proposed improvements have been prepared by CGA, 739 Park Avenue, Ackley Iowa; phone 641-847-3273. REFUNDABLE, provided the following conditions are met: 1) The plans and specifications are returned to CGA complete and in good usable condition and 2) they are returned to the above address within fourteen (14) calendar days after the award of the project.

The proposed work is located in Sections 19, Township 90 North, Range 20 West and Section 24, Township 90 North, Range 21 West in Franklin County, Iowa and consists of the furnishing of all materials, labor, and equipment to complete the approximate quantities of work, all as described in the plans and specifications and as listed as below. One contract will be awarded for all divisions of this project.

The proposed work consists of 1,200 feet of 24" tile; private tile connections; concrete collars; seeding; dewatering; mobilization; and other associated work.

All bids must be filed with the County Auditor on or before the time herein stated. All bids shall be made on forms furnished by the Owner's Engineer and contained in the specifications and must be enclosed in a separate sealed envelope and plainly identified. Each proposal shall be accompanied by deposit of cash, bid bond, cashier's or certified check, or a credit union certified share draft, in a separate sealed envelope in an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the total amount of the bid. The certified or cashier's check, if used, shall be drawn on a bank in Iowa or a bank chartered under the laws of the United States or

said certified share draft should be drawn on a credit union in Iowa or chartered under the laws of the United States; and such check or share draft shall be made payable to the Franklin County Auditor as security that if awarded a contract by resolution of said Supervisors, the Bidder will enter into a contract at the prices bid and furnish the required performance and payment bond and certificate of insurance. The deposit of cash shall be retained, certified or cashier's check or certified share draft may be cashed, or the bid bond redeemed, if the Contractor fails to enter into a contract, or fails to provide a certificate of insurance within ten (10) days after the acceptance of his proposal by resolution of the County Supervisors. No bidder may withdraw a bid within sixty (60) days after the date set for opening bids. If awarded, one (1) contract will be awarded to the lowest, responsive bidder for base bid or one of the alternate bids.

The successful bidder shall be required to execute a performance and payment bond, with sureties approved by the County Auditor in favor of the Drainage Districts for the use and benefit of the Drainage Districts and to all persons entitled to liens for labor or material, in an amount not less than one hundred percent (100%) of the contract price of the work to be done, conditioned for the timely, efficient, and complete performance of his contracts, and the payment, as they become due, of all just claims for labor performed and material used in car-

rying out the contract. When the contract is executed and the performance bond approved, the certified check, share draft, cash deposited, or bid bond provided with the bid shall be returned to the bidder. The performance bond shall be provided at the time the contract for work is signed.

Payment to the Contractor will be made in monthly estimates of ninety percent (90%) of the work completed during the period as provided in Section 468.100, Code of Iowa. Pursuant to Sections 468.101 through 468.103, the balance will be paid not less than 30 days after acceptance of the work by the County Supervisors acting as Trustees of the Drainage District. **All payments to the Contractor shall be made by the County Treasurer by check. No payments shall be made by drainage warrants.**

The work under the proposed contract shall begin within 15 days of the Notice to Proceed. All work is to be completed by December 1, 2022 including seeding and finishing work. The Contractor shall pay the said District Five Hundred (\$500.00) per day as liquidated damages for each calendar day the work remains uncompleted after the completion date stated above.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE FRANKLIN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

JANUARY 31ST, 2022
The Board of Supervisors met at 8:30AM on Monday, January 31st, 2022, at the Franklin County Courthouse with Board members Nolte, McVicker, & Vanness in attendance. Chairman McVicker led the Pledge of Allegiance. Motion by Vanness, seconded by Nolte to approve the Agenda with the additional approval of the special session minutes from 1/28/22. All ayes. Motion carried. Motion by Vanness, seconded by Nolte to approve the Board Minutes from the regular meeting & drainage meeting with one change made to the drainage minutes both dated 1/24/22. All ayes. Motion Carried. Public Comment & Board Committee Reports: Representatives from Apex Clean Wind Energy spoke to the Board of Supervisors about their project and possible wind ordinance for Franklin County. Jay Waddingham, County Engineer, met with the Board and gave an update on his department. Adam Akers, Veterans Affairs Director, was present to give an update to the Board about his department. The Board discussed the current security system and possible changes with Ryan Peterson, Maintenance Director; Joel McWilliams, EMA Director; and Gabe Johanns, IT Director. No decisions were made at this time. Audrey Emery, Human Resource Director, met with the Board to discuss alternatives to the county's current health insurance plan. After a lengthy discussion, the Board decided to not make any changes at this time, but continually monitor it. A joint drainage meeting was held with Hancock and Cerro Gordo Counties pertaining to JDD 1-86-31. Full details may be obtained from the drainage clerk or on the county website. Chad Murray, Treasurer, and Toni Wilkinson, Recorder met with the Board regarding the employee wage scale per Resolution 2021-06. After discussion, the Board said no changes will be made this year. They will continue to review it on an annual basis. Motion by Vanness, seconded by Nolte to approve Franklin County joining NIACOG's Housing Trust Fund Program. All ayes. Motion carried.
